INTRODUCTION

This impact report captures the heart of our mission: to empower individuals, families, and young people through accessible, compassionate mental health services.

The need for mental health support in the San Ramon Valley has never been more urgent. We continue to witness increasing demand for counseling services, particularly among children and adolescents facing anxiety, depression, and the lingering effects of isolation. Discovery Counseling Center has responded by expanding our services, growing our team of skilled therapists, and strengthening our community partnerships to ensure that everyone has access to the care they need.

Our sliding-scale counseling services at our clinic have made it possible for hundreds of individuals and families to receive therapy regardless of their financial circumstances. Through our school-based programs, we have reached over 400 students with crucial early intervention services and fostering emotional resilience among youth. In sum, this year alone between our clinic and school services, we provided 13,511 counseling hours, impacting lives in ways both profound and lasting.

None of this would be possible without the generosity and commitment of people like you. Your support fuels our mission and helps us build a stronger, healthier community. CLINICAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT

I am honored to share the incredible impact we have made this year in our mission to provide accessible and high-quality mental health services to our community. We are grateful for our staff who work tirelessly to support individuals and families in need.

Year after year, we have seen the need for mental health services rising, in the face of a shortage of mental health professionals to meet this demand. At Discovery Counseling Center, we have in this past year provided supervision and training to over 40 pre-licensed clinicians, supporting them on their path from graduate school towards becoming a licensed mental health professional. In addition, through support from local organizations such as the Three Valleys Community Foundation we offer our staff resources to train on meeting the changing cultural makeup of our community in an effort to provide culturally responsive and appropriate services.

If you could listen to the stories of our clients, you would witness the vast range of the human experience: stories of triumph and grief, intense shame and overwhelming joy, love and loss, isolation and connection. You would also see the power of forgiveness—both towards oneself and for others. Each session represents an opportunity for someone to feel seen, supported, and empowered to face life's challenges.

Here, they have someone who can bear witness to their experiences and remind them that they, and those around them, are valuable and worthy of empathy and compassion. 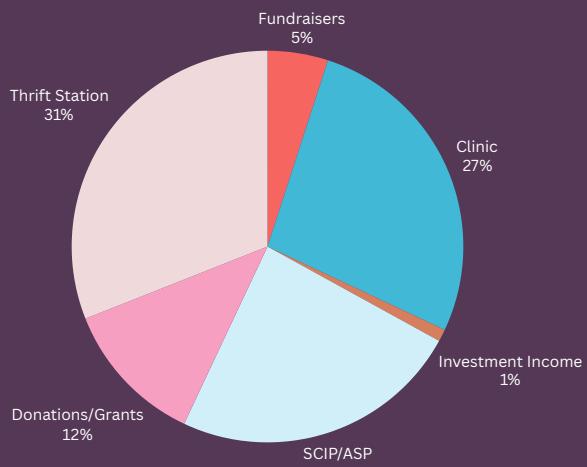
Percentage of revenue raised through clinic services

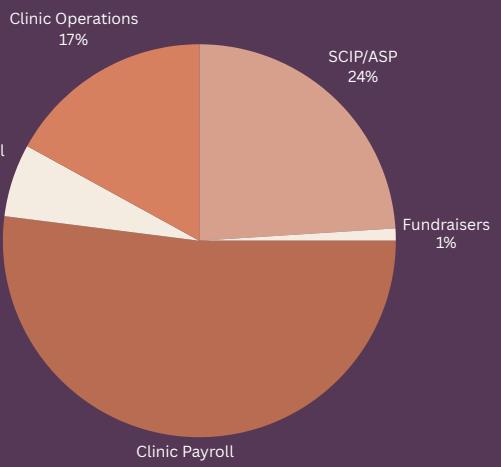

SCHOOL-BASED SERVICES:

ON-SITE CLINICAL THERAPY

The 2023-24 school year marked the thirty-fifth year of Discovery Counseling Center's partnership with the San Ramon Valley Unified School District (SRVUSD) through SCIP (School Counseling Intervention Program). The program offers individual and group counseling to all 36 schools in the district. We were honored to supervise 34 therapists who were on site one to two days per week at each elementary, middle and high school providing clinical services to students.

This year our SCIP counselors served 400 SRVUSD students. From August 2023 through June 2024, the SCIP counselors provided 6,006 counseling sessions and met the following objectives:

- Conducted individual and group sessions with children and adolescents.
- Consulted and collaborated with parents, family members, school principals, counselors, district social workers, teachers, school psychologists, resource teachers and other members of treatment teams.
- Participated in Student Study Team (SST) meetings and Individualized Education Program (IEP) meetings.
- Offered psychoeducation and support to school staff and families.

"I worked with an 8-year-old who was adopted and had relationship issues with her mother. During sessions, we would practice role playing healthy communication skills and feelings around being adopted since they were changing as she was getting older.

Over time this student was able to build confidence in bringing up hard conversations with her mother and use her time in therapy to share her emotions."



Last year, I worked with a student struggling with social anxiety so much that it impacted school attendance and class performance. Together, we identified the student's fears and used anxiety-management skills to gradually increase their comfort in class. We practiced reframing worries, using communication tools, and engaging with peers and teachers. By year-end, attendance and grades improved, and the student reported less distress. This year, they retained progress from SCIP and are focusing on a new treatment area.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION: ASP



The Alternative to Suspension (ASP) program offers support to teens and their families dealing with substance use issues. This program provides assessment, education, and prevention strategies tailored to help adolescents make healthy choices, resist peer pressure, and develop coping skills. Through an individual student and follow up family consultation with our therapists, the ASP program's goal is to move focus from punitive measures only and address underlying challenges, foster resilience, and reduce substance use in order to promote long-term well-being.

We are deeply grateful to these donors, whose support empowers us to provide vital mental health services to our community. Your commitment to our mission strengthens our ability to bring hope, healing, and resilience to those who need it most. Together, we are building a healthier, more compassionate community.
